

While waiting for aviation mechanics training, Isaac has been the Freedom Ministries Motor Pool Maintenance Man. Our Freedom Ministries preaviation-mechanics-training program prepared the 21year-old Aerostar for a cross-country journey and long-term use in Washington. It was a great opportunity for Isaac to overcome hard-to-find, hardto-remove and hard-to-replace parts; to use new tools and innovations; and to research proper procedures and specifications. He did a great job making the van seem 15-years younger.

Cliff-Hanger

With car repair costs mitigated by Isaac's muscle, we were one-camper-sale-away from having the \$5,000 to start the aviation academy. Our trepidation had yet to breach our coping skills.

Voila! Faux pas! Our 9-year-old van's recent reluctance to accelerate was a \$2500 transmission flaw, and a faulty \$250 fuel pump, \$135 EGR, and \$310 catalytic converter. With the looming banquet and auto expenses \$8,500 above our means, nobody buying the camper, and without the \$5,000 cash and \$1,200 committed monthly support due upon our arrival in Washington, it seemed to me a good time to panic. Of course - **I did!**

Then I started thinking of the cliff-hanger story I intend to tell to a church at our first stop along our route to the Trinity Aviation Academy in Wash. It is about a day when I struggled between obeying the Lord's command for a specific tasking and using my work-day trying sell everything I could to save my two oldest children from being sent home from college. I had a \$1,600 previous-month short-fall and the first of four installments of \$3,350 due in 24 hours. Groaning in consternation, I told the Lord I would obey His tasking during my work-day and put off selling everything after my work-day was over.

What makes me think I can suddenly get away with having the funds to do the Lord's tasking prior to my actually being obedient? It's never worked that way before. What hypocrisy to presume to speak to a congregation about faith without being in the middle of a cliff-hanger. Put up or shut up!!!

People of great faith and zeal for the ministry of Christ are critically important to the fulfillment of the mandate upon the church. The harvest is ripe. The laborers are hard at work. Without the resource for food, shelter, transportation, etc., their labor is not sustainable. Yet, they press on - lest the fruit rot on the vine.
